Special Theme Division Definitions

Nature Special Theme – Insects, Reptiles & Amphibians – The insect, reptile, and amphibian theme are restricted to living creatures defined by science as insect, reptile, or amphibian. Common examples include; frogs, lizards, bees, butterflies, and spiders. The list is incomplete; however, no mammals, birds, fish, or mounted subjects are allowed in this theme. The subject should be presented in its natural environment and not be moved to a studio location.

Open Special Theme - Photojournalism/Sports - Photojournalism images should reflect a newsworthy event and be depicted honestly and objectively. The sport's image can be of any sporting event, professional, collegiate, or amateur, including children's events. Manipulating these images is allowed if it does not compromise the image's original intent. However, no elements not originally in the image can be introduced by artificial means.


While I enjoy photographing landscapes, my real passion is focusing on the smaller details in



An Introduction to Rural Wisconsin Virtual Camera Club

Rural Wisconsin Virtual Camera Club (RWVCC) was founded in January of 2022 to help serve areas of Wisconsin that do not have a local camera club. Areas such as the northern parts of the state and the southwest part of the state in particular. These areas do not have very large populations, and the small towns are fairly widespread, making it difficult to find fellow photographers and create a viable club. Through the pandemic, many of us have learned how to effectively use Zoom or other similar programs to meet without being faceto-face. Because of this, we learned how to host a camera club meeting very efficiently. Of course, one of the benefits of this is that it took away the need to travel to a meeting location, which, especially in winter, was a great upside. Additionally, being able to view images for contests, critiques, and just general sharing, by using different programs found on a lot of our computers or utilizing web-based programs helped make meetings very productive and seeing the images much better than can be done in person (depending on where the meeting was held) are other positive results for attending on-line meetings.

RWVCC has started slowly and, as of this writing, has about a dozen members on our list with a lot of potential for further growth. While many awesome established clubs are already in Wisconsin, RWVCC seeks to fill a void by offering a unique club to serve areas where no clubs exist. To that end, we are not looking for those who already belong to a local club, but we are looking to find those photographers throughout the state interested in joining a club but don't have one nearby. A good example of this would be one of our members who lives in northern Wisconsin, over an hour away from Superior, which is a long way to drive for a meeting. She was so happy to find RWVCC and has been an eager contributor during meetings and helping spread the word.

So, what is a typical meeting like? First off, meetings are all held via Zoom on the first Wednesday of each month, September through May, much like most other clubs in the state. Meetings start at 6:30 pm and last about 2 hours. The first hour is devoted to photographyrelated "education" with a different monthly topic. Topics could be software, equipment, techniques, or a general question-and-answer period. For those of you who are familiar with the WACCO Digital Forum, our first hour is similar to what happens during the first hour of those meetings. Our second hour is simply an image review where members submit up to 5 images for review and discussion by the members. It could be an image or images you are working on and want feedback on how to improve them or some images you want to show off. Some months, we may have a theme for images which helps promote getting out to shoot new images to match a theme. As of now, we are not looking to host contests in this club. There are plenty of avenues for entering contests if that is what you would like; our goal is more about education.

As photography interests are quite varied, we welcome all levels of photographers, from those just using a smartphone and their very capable cameras up to professionals and everyone in between.
